The 2026 Black History Month "Theme: A Century of Black History Commemorations"

The St. Mary's County Black History Coalition (SMCBHC) will award its 14th Annual Dinah K. Somerville Scholarships to deserving students who are accepted to or currently attending an accredited college, university, trade, or technical school for the 2026-2027 school year. The SMCBHC will award \$1,000 to four students, payable directly to the institution of their choice.

The Dinah K. Somerville Scholarship is for students deserving of tuition, fees, and other educational expenses assistance. As it is a merit-based scholarship, the Award will be based on several factors, including the student's academic achievement, honors and awards received, commitment to extracurricular activities, and engagement in community services.

It will also be based on the effectiveness of your writing skills per the criteria set forth for submission of your essay. If there is a reason for not responding in any of the fields, you must explain. When using abbreviations, please spell out the term in full, followed by the abbreviation. Please be clear and precise in each response. If additional space is needed, an additional page may be added.

Awards, Eligibility Requirements, and Scholarship Application Instructions

Scholarship Awards

- Four (4), one thousand dollars (\$1,000/student) scholarships will be awarded to four deserving students who are accepted to or currently attending an accredited College, University, Trade or Technical school.
- Application deadline is January 23, 2026.
- Candidates will be notified of their application status by February 13, 2026.
- Scholarship funds will be payable to the college or other institutions of higher learning. These funds will be available by the first semester of the 2026-2027 academic year.
- Scholarships will be awarded on an objective and non-discriminatory basis. Applicants will not be assessed based on race, creed, color, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability.

Eligibility Requirements

- U.S. Citizen.
- Attended High School in St. Mary's County or currently attending an accredited College, University, Trade or Technical school.
- Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0
- Current involvement in one or more of the following activities:
 - -Community Service Project
 - -Volunteer Work
 - -Athletics, performing arts, or another group/team participation
 - -Employment
- Award recipients must attend the SMCBHC Annual Award Ceremony and Black History Celebration on Sunday, February 22, 2026, to receive the scholarship.

Application Process and Supporting Documents

- Complete scholarship application (pages 3, 4, and 5).
- Provide an essay (800 1000 words) from the topics listed on Page 6 of the Essay Questions.
- Prospective students must include a copy of their acceptance letter to an accredited institution of higher learning.
- Include a current high school, college, university, trade, or technical school transcript, showing GPA.

Essay Topics

Submit an original typed essay on a separate page(s). The essay shall be double-spaced with 800-1000 words. Use a 12-point font, Times New Roman, one-inch margins on top, bottom, and sides, and ensure the essay is left-justified. Insert page numbers at the bottom, centered (no page number on title page). The essay should fit on standard $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ white paper. Include a Title Page that includes the essay topic statement and the student's full name (centered on the page).

Note: No colored text (black text only), pictures, or computer links.

Select and respond to **ONE** of the following statements:

- (1) Do you believe that it's important to commemorate Black History? Why?
- (2) Why does Black History matter?
- (3) Provide the name of an African American and how their leadership helped you in your personal growth?

Please read the article from the Association for the Study of African American Life and History entitled "A CENTURY OF BLACK HISTORY COMMEMORATIONS" as a guide in assisting you in writing your essay.
